

Sonoma Valley Regional Park Expansion Master Plan

October 28, 2015 Meeting Data Summary

Sixteen community members signed in and participated

Nine comment cards were collected

Comments below

- #1 Concern steep grades on trails without steps
Move restrooms
Limited facilities beyond existing parking and possible additional restroom

- #2 Limited trail & vista development on SDC 41 keep use away from butler creek
Limit trails on curreri in both extent and use type; ie hiking only
Plant screen around neighbor's property @ Curreri, keep trail alignment.
Continue to remove fencing

- #3 Pedestrian only trails
Mixed use trail
Restrooms

- #4 Keep trails different – horses & bikes OK, but also hiking only – steps OK – for hikers
Check on invasive species & keep them out

- #5 Native American landscape management education center
How we can show examples of pre-european presence

- #6 Multi-use loop trails with easier and more challenging options sustainable
Annex SDC ASAP

- #7 Looped Trails
Education for children – address nature deficit

- #8 Bikes, running, horses, dogs, people, children, education for all, supporting wildlife
Get SDC property for the park too! (heart)
Woof! Woof! Thanks for allowing dogs (heart)
Picnic Table or two for just being in nature
Open for wildlife – no fencing
Open for public use – for people to enjoy
Providing habitat – shelter (natural) for animals
Children's learning about nature – education
Try some different management techniques – to see how the forest responds
Poison oak removal

- #9 Restore oak forest along trails
Try to acquire more of SDC for open space

- Upgrade restroom at trailhead
- Annex Suttonfield lake to Regional Parks
- Create loop trail on SDC41

- Experimental Station- native land management, fire, invasives, biochar (vegetation fire – residuals enrich soil that holds carbon, water and nutrients), crafts

Partner with Bouverie






