





Pack out your trash, including pet waste, to keep the river clean. Discarded fishing lines and hooks harm birds and other wildlife.

- Take your raft or tube home with you. When left behind, rafts, tubes and other floats harm wildlife and the river ecosystem.
 Cell phone reception is limited or non-existent at
- some beaches. Calling 911 is not always possible, so be extremely cautious around the water.
- Healdsburg Veterans Memorial Beach has lifeguards on duty regularly in the summer.
 Lifeguards patrol other beaches intermittently on summer weekends.
- Wear a life jacket. Borrow a free life jacket Memorial Day weekend through Labor Day at Del Rio Woods, Steelhead, Sunset, and Forestville River Access beaches. Just return it when you leave.

- Directly supervise children around the water keep children within arm's reach.
- River conditions can change from year to year. Watch for hazards like snags, fallen trees, brush, bridges and pilings.
- Stay sober when in, on, or around the water. Both alcohol and cannabis use impair balance, judgment and reflexes.
- No fires, including bonfires and BBQs, on all Sonoma County beaches.
- Keep dogs on leash, even while they're swimming.
 Use a restroom! Human waste in rivers causes contamination and harm to wildlife. The Russian River
- While Boating: Carry a U.S. Coast Guard-approved life jacket for every person in the vessel. Children under 16 must wear one.


Streamlined Waste Disposal

- Removed ~35 cans from River parks
- 2020- 157 cases of trash bags
- 2021- 101 cases of trash bags
- 2022- 85 cases of trash bags
