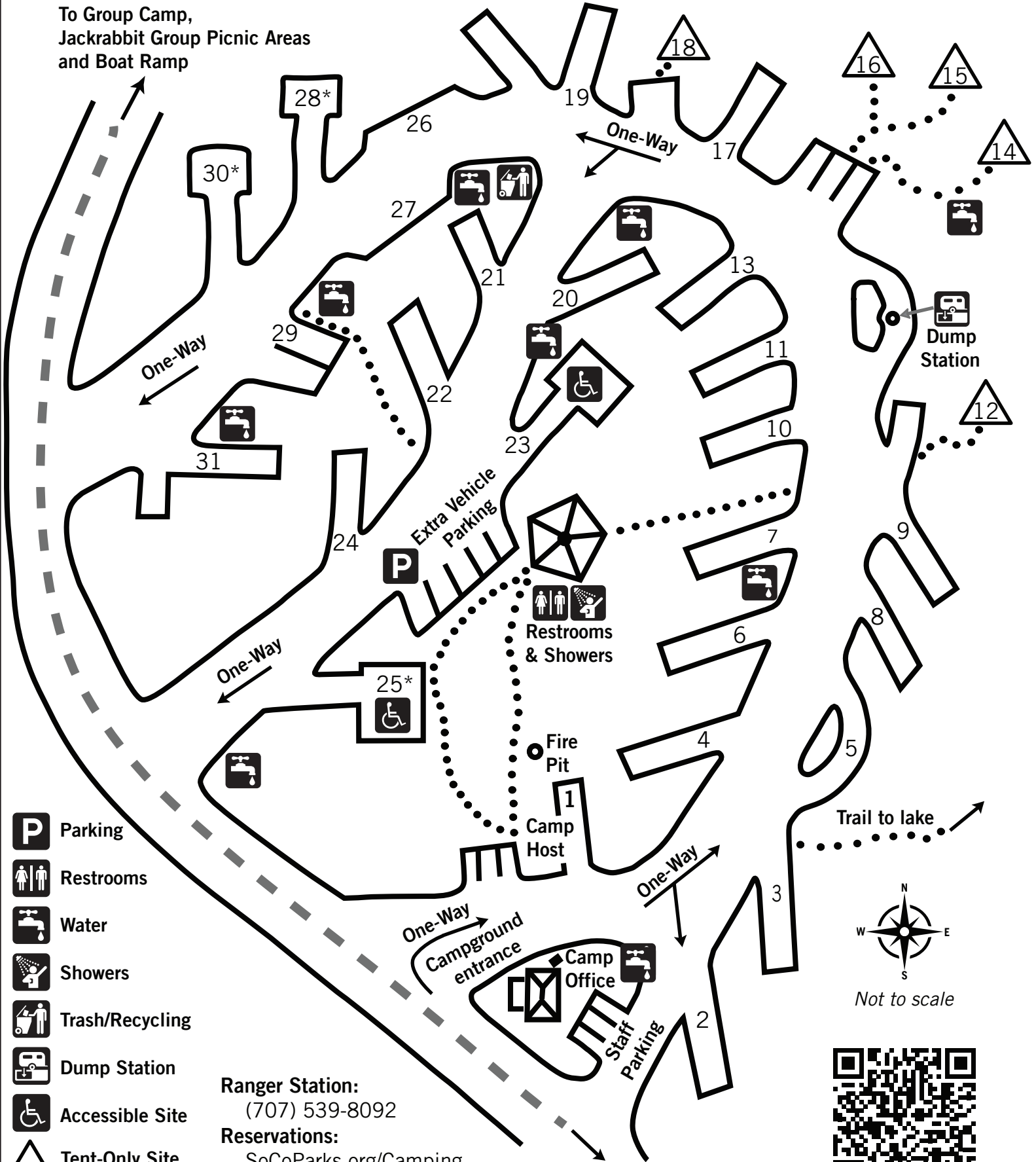


# Spring Lake Regional Park Campground Map

# Spring Lake Regional Park



## Campground Information and Policies

- **Check-In and Check-Out Times:** Check-in is at 2 p.m. Check-out is at 12 p.m. No-show reservation holders forfeit all paid fees. Sites must be occupied each night. Site saving is prohibited.
- **Reservations:** Reservations are available up to 12 months in advance. Same day reservations are available until 8 p.m. online or with park staff onsite. Payment is due at the time of booking. To make a reservation visit [SoCoParks.org/Camping](http://SoCoParks.org/Camping) or call (707) 565-2267. Specific sites are not guaranteed due to the potential for unexpected conditions (flooding, fallen tree, etc.) No refunds will be allowed due to weather. Campsites 12, 14, 15, 16 and 18 are exclusively for tent camping. Sites 25, 28 and 30 feature sleeping cabins.
- **Site Capacity:** A maximum of 8 people (including children) and two allowed vehicles may occupy an individual campsite. Camping fees include one vehicle per site as well as one towed vehicle or trailer. A second non-towed vehicle may be parked at most campsites for a fee of \$10 per night. There is a separate group campground at Spring Lake available for reservation.
- **Utility Hook-ups:** Spring Lake campsites do not have electrical hook-ups. Wastewater or gray water must be contained and disposed of at the RV dump station.
- **Quiet Hours and Generator Use:** Quiet hours are 10 p.m. - 7 a.m.; generator hours are 8 a.m. - 8 p.m.
- **Pets:** Pets must be attended, cleaned up after, securely leashed and under physical control on a leash no longer than 6 feet, or contained within a vehicle or tent. Proof of rabies vaccination is required. A fee of \$2 per dog, per night will be charged.
- **Campfires:** Campfires are allowed in designated barbecues and fire rings only. Burn all wood to ash, have enough water on hand to completely extinguish your fire and be sure the fire is completely out and cold before you leave it. Wood gathering is not allowed. Bundled wood is usually available for purchase from the campground host. Campfires are banned during Red Flag Warnings, high wind advisories and Spare the Air days. Gas stoves and barbecues are allowed unless otherwise prohibited.
- **Juveniles:** Persons under 18 must be accompanied by a parent/guardian.
- **Accessible Sites:** Sites 23 (campsite) and 25 (sleeping cabin) are ADA accessible facilities designated for use by people with disabilities. To reserve site 23, a member of your party must qualify as disabled under the guidelines determined by your state.
- **Stay Limits:** Spring Lake Regional Park campers are permitted to stay up to 20 nights in a calendar year, including 10 consecutive nights if the site is available and a stay limit of 10 days per season.
- **Wildlife:** Protect wildlife – and your food – by securely storing your meals and trash in containers or vehicles. Close restroom doors, trash cans and dumpster lids. Feeding, disturbing or harassing wildlife is prohibited.
